REGULATIONS UNDER THE EMERGENCY SERVICES FUNDING ACT 1998

Emergency Services Funding (Remissions—Motor Vehicles and Vessels) Regulations 2000

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Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Emergency Services Funding (Remissions—Motor Vehicles and Vessels) Regulations 2000*.

Commencement

2. These regulations will come into operation on 1 July 2000.

Interpretation

3. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

"the Act" means the *Emergency Services Funding Act 1998*;

"levy" means the levy under Part 3 Division 2 of the Act.

Remission of levy on cars and motorcycles

4. A person who is liable to pay a levy in relation to the 2000/2001 financial year or a subsequent financial year on the registration, or the renewal of the registration, of a motor vehicle in Premium Class Code 1, 15, 16, 20, 51, 66 or 70 (car or motorcycle) is entitled to a remission of \$8.00.

Remission of levy on metropolitan primary production goods vehicles

5. A person who is liable to pay a levy in relation to the 2000/2001 financial year or a subsequent financial year on the registration, or the renewal of the registration, of a vehicle in Premium Class Code PCC4 (primary production—goods) is entitled to a remission of \$20.00.

Remission of levy on trailers

6. A person who is liable to pay a levy in relation to the 2000/2001 financial year or a subsequent financial year on the registration, or the renewal of the registration, of a motor vehicle in Premium Class Code 11 or 61 (trailer) is entitled to a remission of the whole of the levy.

Remission of levy on historic and left hand drive vehicles

7. (1) A person who is liable to pay a levy in relation to one or more of the financial years referred to in subregulation (2) on the registration, or the renewal of the registration, of a motor vehicle as a historic vehicle or a left hand drive vehicle under section 25 of the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959* is entitled to a remission of part of the levy in respect of the vehicle.

(2) The financial years to which subregulation (1) relates are the 2000/2001, 2001/2002, 2002/2003 and 2003/2004 financial years.

(3) The amount of the remission is such amount as is required to reduce the levy in respect of the vehicle to \$6.00.

Remission of levy on recreational vessels

8. (1) A person who is liable to pay a levy in relation to the 2000/2001 financial year or a subsequent financial year on the registration, or the renewal of the registration, of a recreational vessel fitted with an engine is entitled to a remission of the whole of the levy.

(2) In subregulation (1), "recreational vessel" has the same meaning as in the *Harbors and Navigation Act 1993*.

Proportionate reduction of remission

9. (1) The amount of a remission prescribed by these regulations is in respect of the levy paid, or payable, for the whole of a financial year in relation to which the remission applies.

(2) If a proportion of a levy is paid, or payable, in respect of part of a financial year, the person liable to pay the levy is entitled to the same proportion of the remission prescribed by these regulations for that year.
