#### 1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Public Intoxication Regulations 2004*.

#### 3—Interpretation

In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

*Act* means the *Public Intoxication Act 1984*;

*petrol* includes any volatile liquid containing hydrocarbons;

*volatile substance* means a substance declared to be a volatile solvent under section 12(7) of the *Controlled Substances Act 1984*.

#### 4—Declaration of substances as a drug (section 5)

For the purposes of the Act, the following substances are declared to be drugs:

- (a) petrol;
- (b) volatile substances.
