## Electrical Products Variation Proclamation 2003

under section 5 of the *Electrical Products Act 2000*

### Part 1—Preliminary

#### 1—Short title

This proclamation may be cited as the *Electrical Products Variation Proclamation 2003*.

#### 2—Commencement

- (1) Subject to subclause (2), this proclamation comes into operation on the day on which it is made.
- (2) Clause 4(2) of this proclamation will come into operation on 1 March 2003.

#### 3—Variation provisions

In this proclamation, a provision under a heading referring to the variation of a specified proclamation varies the proclamation so specified.
