The Parliament of South Australia enacts as follows:

Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

5 This Act may be cited as the *Controlled Substances (Miscellaneous) Amendment Act 2016*.

2—Commencement

This Act will come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation.

3—Amendment provisions

10 In this Act, a provision under a heading referring to the amendment of a specified Act amends the Act so specified.

Part 2—Amendment of *Controlled Substances Act 1984*

4—Amendment of section 16—Sale of certain poisons

Section 16(4)—delete subsection (4) and substitute:

- 15 (4) A person who sells poisons to which this section applies must keep prescribed records.
Maximum penalty: \$10 000.

5—Amendment of section 18—Regulation of prescription drugs

Section 18(1d)(c) and (d)—delete paragraphs (c) and (d) and substitute:

- 20 (c) a person may administer a prescription drug (not being a drug of dependence) to another person if—
- (i) the person is licensed to do so by the Minister; or
 - (ii) the drug has been lawfully prescribed for, or supplied to, that other person;

- (d) a person may administer a prescription drug (not being a drug of dependence) to an animal if—
- (i) the person is licensed to do so by the Minister; or
 - (ii) the drug has been lawfully prescribed or supplied for that animal.
