#### 2—Transitional provision—Children's Protection Act 1993

A criminal history report prepared by CrimTrac or a CrimTrac accredited agency or broker will, for the purposes of section 8BA of the *Children's Protection Act 1993* as in force after the commencement of Part 2 of this Act, be taken to be a criminal history report prepared by the ACC.

A criminal history report prepared by CrimTrac or a CrimTrac accredited agency or broker will, for the purposes of section 5C of the *Disability Services Act 1993* as in force after the commencement of Part 4 of this Act, be taken to be a criminal history report prepared by the ACC.
