**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Public and Environmental Health (Notifiable Diseases) Regulations, 1989*.

**Commencement**

2. These regulations will come into operation on 7 December, 1989.

**Interpretation**

3. In these regulations—

"the Act" means the *Public and Environmental Health Act, 1987*.

**Notification of diseases**

4. \* \* \* \* \*

(2) For the purposes of section 30(1) and (4) of the Act, persons who are in charge of pathology laboratories are a prescribed class.

**Presumption of diseases**

5. (1) The following diseases are prescribed as notifiable diseases for the purposes of the Act:

- Chlamydia Infection*
- Human Immunodeficiency Virus*
- Legionellosis*

(2) The following diseases are prescribed as controlled notifiable diseases for the purposes of the Act:

- Human Immunodeficiency Virus.*
