#### APPENDIX LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

#### Citation

**1.** These regulations may be cited as the *Public and Environmental Health (Notifiable Diseases) Regulations, 1989.* 

#### Commencement

2. These regulations will come into operation on 7 December, 1989.

#### Interpretation

3. In these regulations—

"the Act" means the Public and Environmental Health Act, 1987.

#### Notification of diseases

(2) For the purposes of section 30(1) and (4) of the Act, persons who are in charge of pathology laboratories are a prescribed class.

#### **Presumption of diseases**

5. (1) The following diseases are prescribed as notifiable diseases for the purposes of the Act:

Anthrax Chlamydia Infection Donovanosis Haemolytic-uraemic Syndrome (HUS) Human Immunodeficiency Virus Infection caused by E.Coli capable of producing Shiga toxin Invasive Pneumococcal Disease Legionellosis Lyssavirus Infection Varicella-Zoster Infection.

(2) The following diseases are prescribed as controlled notifiable diseases for the purposes of the Act:

Human Immunodeficiency Virus Lyssavirus Infection.
