National Parks and Wildlife (Glenthorne Development Trust) Proclamation 2022

under section 45B of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972*

1—Short title

This proclamation may be cited as the *National Parks and Wildlife (Glenthorne Development Trust) Proclamation 2022*.

2—Commencement

This proclamation comes into operation on the day on which it is made.

3—Establishment of Glenthorne Development Trust

- (1) A Development Trust (*the Trust*) is established in relation to the following reserves:
 - Glenthorne National Park—Ityamaiitpinna Yarta
 - Hallett Cove Conservation Park
 - Marino Conservation Park
- (2) The name of the Trust is *Glenthorne Development Trust*.
- (3) The Trust consists of 7 members appointed by the Minister responsible for the administration of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972* (*the Minister*).
- (4) The quorum for meetings of the Trust is 4 members.
- (5) A member of the Trust must be appointed for a term not exceeding 4 years and may be reappointed at the end of a term for a further term not exceeding 4 years.
- (6) The Minister may remove a member of the Trust from office for—
 - (a) breach of, or non-compliance with, a condition of appointment; or
 - (b) misconduct; or
 - (c) neglect of duty; or
 - (d) incapacity to carry out the duties of the office satisfactorily.
- (7) The office of a member of the Trust becomes vacant if the member—
 - (a) dies; or
 - (b) completes a term of office and is not reappointed; or
 - (c) resigns by written notice addressed to the Minister; or
 - (d) is removed from office in accordance with subclause (6).
- (8) If the office of a member of the Trust becomes vacant, the Minister may appoint a person in accordance with this proclamation to the vacant office.
