Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Variation Regulations 2003*.

2—Commencement

These regulations will come into operation on 8 December 2003.

3—Variation provisions

In these regulations, a provision under a heading referring to the variation of specified regulations varies the regulations so specified.

Part 2—Variation of *Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 1999*

4—Substitution of regulation 10

Regulation 10—delete the regulation and substitute:

10—Vehicles permitted in bus lanes

For the purposes of rule 158(2) (Exceptions to driving in special purpose lanes etc)—

- (a) the driver of a taxi is permitted to drive in a bus lane; and
-

(b) the rider of a bicycle is permitted to ride in a bus lane.

10A—Bus only lanes

- (1) A driver (except the driver of a public bus or emergency vehicle) must not drive in a bus only lane.

Maximum penalty: \$1 250.

- (2) In this regulation—

bus only lane means a marked lane, or the part of a marked lane, the road surface of which is painted red and marked with the words "bus only" in white letters.

Note—

As required by section 10AA(2) of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1978*, the Minister has certified that, in the Minister's opinion, it is necessary or appropriate that these regulations come into operation as set out in these regulations.
