Schedule 1—Plans to be substituted

Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas—Long Term) Variation Regulations 2004*.

2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

3—Variation provisions

In these regulations, a provision under a heading referring to the variation of specified regulations varies the regulations so specified.

4—Variation of Schedule 1—Long term dry areas

- (1) Schedule 1, item headed "Adelaide—Area 1", column headed "Period"—delete "1 November 2004" and substitute:

29 October 2006

- (2) Schedule 1, item headed "North Adelaide—Area 1", column headed "Period"—delete "1 November 2004" and substitute:

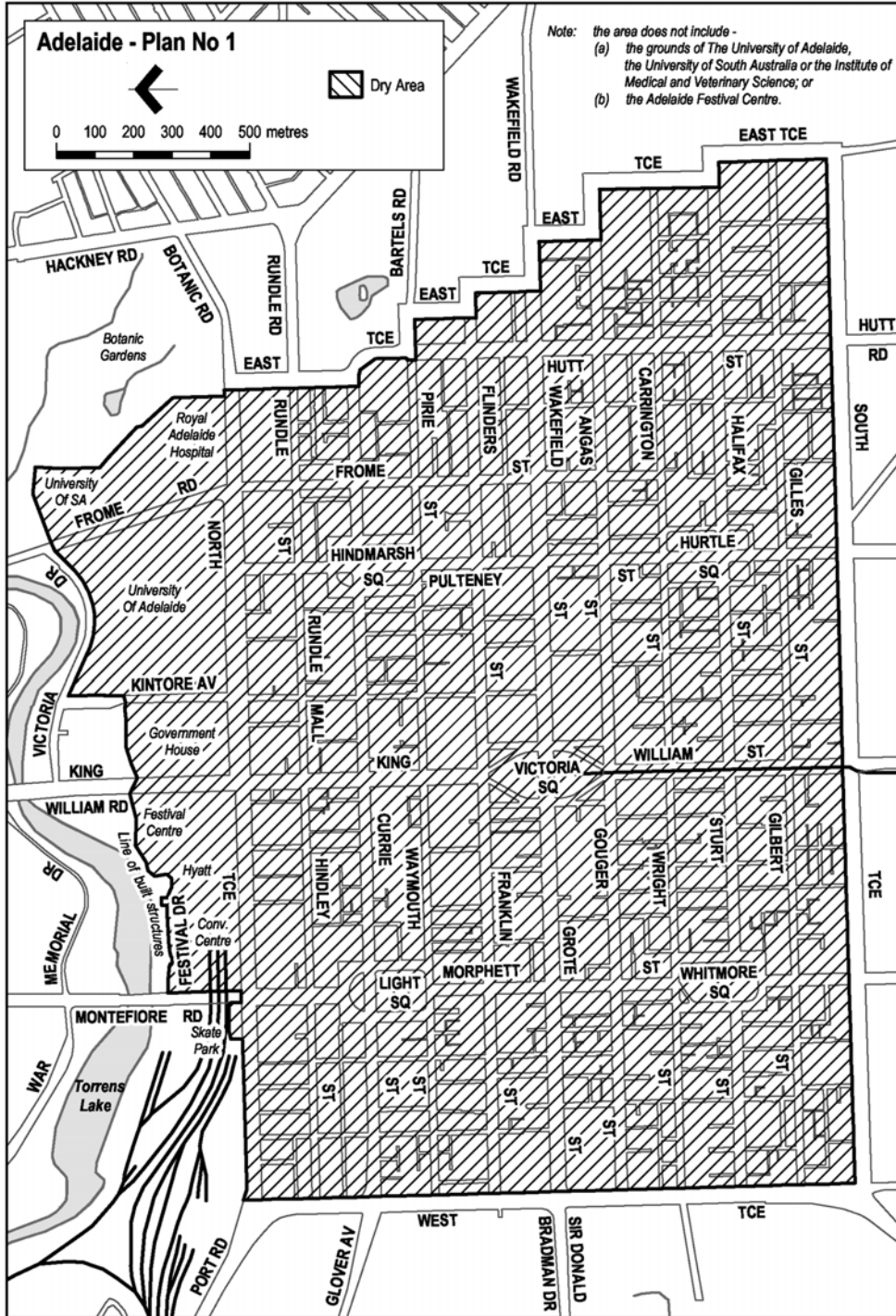

5—Variation of Schedule 2—Plans of long term dry areas

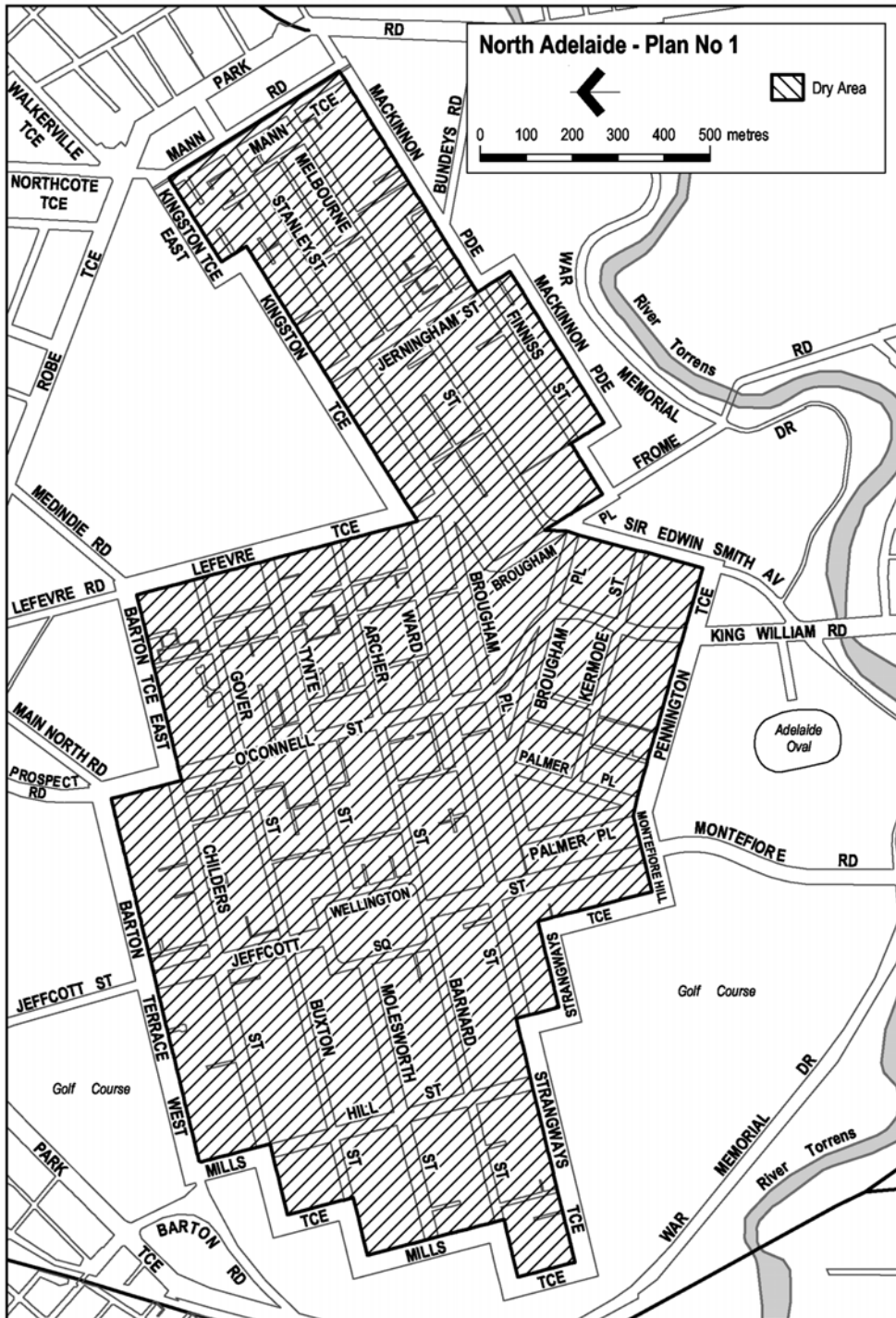
- (1) Schedule 2, plan headed "Adelaide—Plan No 1"—delete the plan and substitute the plan headed "Adelaide—Plan No 1" in Schedule 1 of these regulations
- (2) Schedule 2, plan headed "North Adelaide—Plan No 1"—delete the plan and substitute the plan headed "North Adelaide—Plan No 1" in Schedule 1 of these regulations
