### 1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas—Long Term)* Variation Regulations 2004.

(1) Schedule 1, item headed "Adelaide—Area 1", column headed "Period"—delete "1 November 2004" and substitute:



(2) Schedule 1, item headed "North Adelaide—Area 1", column headed "Period"—delete "1 November 2004" and substitute:


