Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Controlled Substances (Poisons) Variation Regulations 2007.*

2—Commencement

These regulations will come into operation on 1 June 2007.

3—Variation provisions

In these regulations, a provision under a heading referring to the variation of specified regulations varies the regulations so specified.

- 4—Variation of regulation 31B—Special restrictions on prescription or supply of drugs of dependence by medical practitioners, dentists and veterinary surgeons
 - (1) Regulation 31B(1)(c)—after "spouse," insert:

domestic partner,

- (2) Regulation 31B(3)—delete subregulation (3) and substitute:
 - (3) In this regulation—

domestic partner means a person who is a domestic partner within the meaning of the *Family Relationships Act 1975*, whether declared as such under that Act or not;

spouse—a person is the spouse of another if they are legally married.
