1—Short title

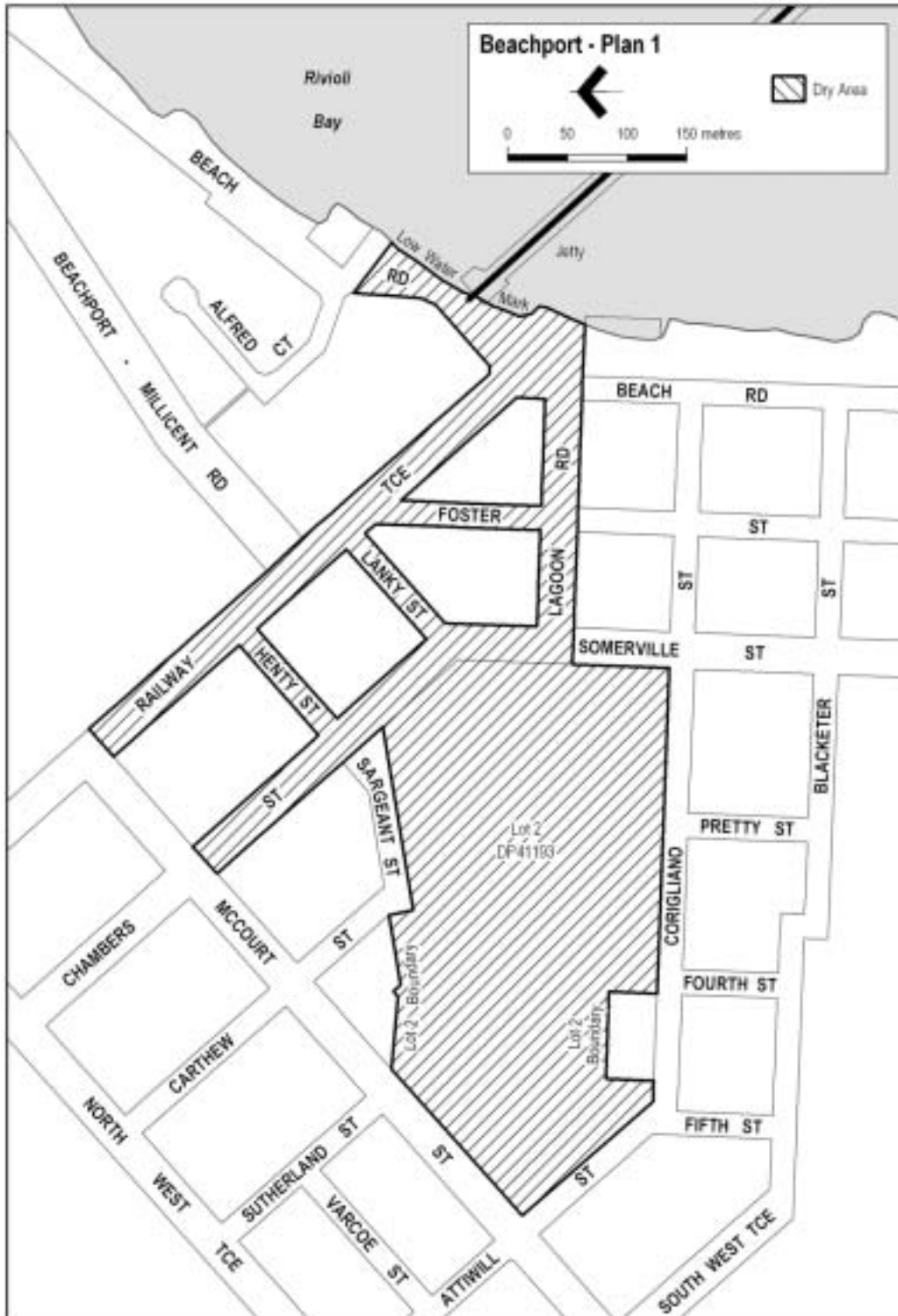
