## Part 1—Preliminary

## 1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas—Short Term) Variation Regulations 2007.* 

## 2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

## **3**—Variation provisions

In these regulations, a provision under a heading referring to the variation of specified regulations varies the regulations so specified.

## Part 2—Variation of *Liquor Licensing* (Dry Areas—Short Term) **Regulations 1997**

### 4—Variation of Schedule 1—Short term dry areas

Schedule 1, item headed "Adelaide—Area 1 (Bonython Park)"—delete the item and substitute:

#### Adelaide—Area 1 (Bonython Park)

(there is no plan for this area)

The area in the City of Adelaide generally known 4 p.m. on as Bonython Park, being the area bounded by the 11 January 2008 River Torrens, the eastern boundary of Port Road to 1 a.m. on and the western boundary of the railway reserve running between Port Road and the River Torrens (on the eastern side of the Old Adelaide Gaol).

13 January 2008.

The consumption of liquor is prohibited and the possession of liquor is prohibited.
