Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Supreme Court Variation Regulations 2007*.

2—Commencement

These regulations will come into operation four months after the day on which they are made (see *Subordinate Legislation Act 1978* section 10AA).

In these regulations, a provision under a heading referring to the variation of specified regulations varies the regulations so specified.

Regulation 4—delete "Residential Tenancies Tribunal is prescribed." and substitute:

following tribunals are prescribed:
