Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas—Short Term) Variation Regulations 2010*.

2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

Adelaide—Area 4 (Rymill Park)

(there is no plan for this area)

The area in the City of Adelaide generally known as Rymill Park, being the area bounded by Rundle Road, Dequetteville Terrace, Bartels Road and East Terrace.
