1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Mutual Recognition (South Australia)* (Environment Protection) Regulations 2015.

2—Commencement

These regulations will come into operation immediately after the *Environment Protection (Solid Fuel Heaters) Policy 2015* comes into operation.

3—Interpretation

In these regulations—

Act means the Mutual Recognition (South Australia) Act 1993.

4—Temporary exemption—Environment Protection (Solid Fuel Heaters) Policy 2015

- (1) For the purposes of section 5 of the Act and section 15 of the Commonwealth Act, the *Environment Protection (Solid Fuel Heaters) Policy 2015* is declared to be a law to which section 15 of the Commonwealth Act applies.
- (2) The exemption from the Commonwealth Act under this regulation has effect for a period of 12 months following the commencement of this regulation.

Note—

As required by section 10AA(2) of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1978*, the Minister has certified that, in the Minister's opinion, it is necessary or appropriate that these regulations come into operation as set out in these regulations.
