Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Fisheries Management (Lakes and Coorong Fishery) (Yabby Pots) Amendment Regulations 2023*.

2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on 1 July 2023.

Part 2—Amendment of *Fisheries Management (Lakes and Coorong Fishery) Regulations 2009*

3—Amendment of regulation 3—Interpretation

- (1) Regulation 3(1)—after the definition of *pipi quota entitlement* insert:

pyramid net has the same meaning as in the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2017*;

pyramid net entitlement means the maximum number of pyramid nets that the holder of a licence in respect of the fishery may lawfully use at any 1 time to take aquatic resources under the licence;

- (2) Regulation 3(1), definitions of *yabby pot* and *yabby pot entitlement*—delete the definitions

4—Amendment of regulation 9—Mesh net and yabby pot entitlements

- (1) Regulation 9, heading—delete "yabby pot" and substitute:
 pyramid net
- (2) Regulation 9(2)—delete "yabby pot" wherever occurring and substitute in each case:
 pyramid net
- (3) Regulation 9(3)—delete "yabby pot" and substitute:
 pyramid net
