Legislative history

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Fruit and Plant Protection Regulations 1996*.

2—Commencement

These regulations will come into operation on 4 November 1996.

3—Interpretation

In these regulations—

Act means the *Fruit and Plant Protection Act 1992*.

4—Expiation fee

For the purposes of section 13(7) of the Act, the following scale of expiation fees is prescribed:

- (a) \$55: if the offence involves 10 or less—
 - bunches of grapes; or
 - punnets of berryfruits; or
 - other fruits; or
 - living plants; or
 - plant cuttings; or
- (b) \$105: if the offence involves more than 10 but not more than 20—
 - bunches of grapes; or
 - punnets of berryfruits; or
 - other fruits; or
 - living plants; or
 - plant cuttings; or

(c) \$210: in any other case.
