Legislative history

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Historic Shipwrecks Regulations 1999*.

2—Commencement

These regulations will come into operation on 1 September 1999.

3—Revocation

The *Historic Shipwrecks Regulations 1982* (see *Gazette 28.10.1982 p1222*) are revoked.

4—Interpretation

In these regulations—

Act means the *Historic Shipwrecks Act 1981*.

5—Fee for copy of Register

For the purposes of section 12(3) of the Act, the prescribed fee is \$1.10 per page copied of the Register.

6—Prohibition of certain acts in protected zone unless permitted by Minister

For the purposes of section 14 of the Act, a person must not, except in accordance with a permit of the Minister granted under section 15(1) of the Act, do any of the following acts:

- (a) bring into a protected zone—
 - (i) equipment constructed or adapted for the purposes of diving, salvage or recovery operations; or

- (ii) explosives, instruments or tools,
the use of which would be likely to damage or interfere with a historic shipwreck or historic relic situated within the protected zone;
- (b) use within a protected zone any such equipment, explosives, instruments or tools;
- (c) cause a ship carrying such equipment, explosives, instruments or tools to enter, or remain within, a protected zone;
- (d) trawl, dive or engage in any other underwater activity, within a protected zone;
- (e) moor or use ships within a protected zone.

Maximum penalty: \$1 000 or imprisonment for 1 year, or both.

7—Identity card

- (1) For the purposes of section 21(2) of the Act, the identity card issued to an inspector must be substantially in accordance with the form set out in the Schedule.
- (2) Each identity card issued must be numbered consecutively.
