Roads (Opening and Closing) Fees Regulations 1991

under the *Roads (Opening and Closing) Act 1991*

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1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Roads (Opening and Closing) Fees Regulations 1991*.

3—Interpretation

In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
the Act means the *Roads (Opening and Closing) Act 1991*.

4—Fees

The fees set out in the Schedule are payable to the Surveyor-General for the purposes set out in that Schedule.

5—Refund of fees

The Surveyor-General may refund the whole or any part of a fee paid to the Surveyor-General under these regulations where—

- (a) the matter or action for which the fee was paid is of a minor nature or is not completed; and
- (b) the Surveyor-General is of the opinion that the refund is appropriate in the circumstances.

9	On application for a road width declaration by the Surveyor-General	\$46.30
