1. These regulations may be cited as the *Supreme Court (Fees) Regulations, 1987*.
2. These regulations will come into operation on 14 December, 1987.
3. The *Supreme Court (Fees) Regulations, 1983* (No. 154 of 1983, see *Gazette*, 22 September, 1983, p. 945) as varied, are revoked.
4. The fees payable in respect of proceedings in the court are as set out in the schedule.

1. On filing—	
(a) a document by which a proceeding in the court is commenced	441.00

<i>(No further fee is payable for filing pleadings or particulars or for any interlocutory application, interlocutory motion, application for directions or application for immediate relief, for signing judgement, or for any necessary affidavit or document)</i>	
2. On—	
(a) filing or lodging an application, notice or other document that does not relate to a proceeding for which a fee has been paid under item 1; or	
(b) sealing a certificate; or	
(c) certifying under seal that a document is a true copy	28.00
3. For each request to search and inspect a record of the court, other than a Divorce or Matrimonial Causes record	8.00
<i>(A fee is not, however, payable under this clause for a request in respect of a record relating to criminal proceedings by or on behalf of the person accused in those proceedings or the victim of the offence that is the subject of those proceedings).</i>	
4. For a plain or office copy of a document (other than a copy of evidence)	2.00 per page
5. For a copy of evidence	4.50 per page
6. For a copy of reasons for judgment	4.50 per page
<i>(However, one copy will be supplied to a party to the proceedings free of charge)</i>	
7. For a copy of a computer disc containing the record of court proceedings (including the reasons for judgment)	the fee that would be payable under these regulations for a printed copy of the record of the proceedings plus \$42.00 for each day or part of a day on which the proceedings were recorded.
8. For production of transcript on the request of a party where the court does not require the transcript	9.00 per page
9. Trial fee payable by the plaintiff	208.00 for each day or part of a day during which the trial is heard.
<i>(The trial fee payable in relation to a trial that commenced on or after 1 July in a particular year but before 1 July in the following year is the fee that was payable immediately before 1 July of that following year.)</i>	

Suitors' Funds

10. On interest collected on funds in court or credited to an account 3% of the amount of interest

(This fee may be charged either from time to time or prior to the payment or transfer of interest out of any fund or money in court. However, if the total amount of interest does not exceed \$10, no fee is payable.)

Fees Payable on Taxation of Costs

11. On lodging a bill of costs 28.00
12. For taxing a bill of costs 5% of the amount allowed on taxation (to the nearest dollar)

Miscellaneous

13. On serving on a Registrar of the Magistrates Court copies of a notice of appeal to the Supreme Court against the decision of the Magistrates Court pursuant to section 42 of the *Magistrates Court Act 1991* 73.00
(This fee is payable to the Magistrates Court when the appeal is lodged).

14. For opening Registry (or Registry remaining open) after hours for urgent execution of process 139.00 per hour or part of an hour.

15. For opening court (or court remaining open) after hours for urgent hearing 415.00 per hour or part of an hour.

PART 2—FEES PAYABLE UNDER RULES REGULATING THE ADMISSION OF PRACTITIONERS

16. On application for admission or re-admission as a practitioner 213.00

PART 3—FEES TO BE TAKEN BY OFFICERS OF THE COURT OR COMMISSIONERS FOR TAKING AFFIDAVITS

17. On taking an affidavit or an affirmation or attestation upon honour or a declaration (for each person making the affidavit, affirmation, attestation upon honour or declaration)—
- (a) if taken by a Commissioner who has to travel more than one kilometre from his or her residence or office or, in the case of an officer of the court, one kilometre from the Registry 4.00
 - (b) in any other case—
 - if taken within the State 1.00
 - if taken outside the State 2.00
18. For attesting a document required to be attested by a Commissioner for taking affidavits 1.00
19. Commissioner's fee on execution of bail in the Admiralty jurisdiction, including any affidavit of justification 8.00

PART 4—FEES TO BE TAKEN IN MARSHAL'S OFFICE

20. Receiving and entering a writ of summons, warrant of release, decree, order, commission or other instrument under the seal of the court 27.00
21. For service of a writ of summons 22.00

22. For the execution of—	
(a) a warrant for the seizure of a ship, cargo or other goods	42.00
(b) a writ of attachment (for each person)	42.00
23. Where a writ of summons is served at the same time as a warrant of arrest is executed, the following fee is payable instead of the fees under items 21 and 22	57.00
24. For the release of any ship, goods, or person from seizure or arrest	22.00
25. For the execution of a commission of appraisalment or sale	42.00
26. For the execution of any decree, order, commission or instrument other than those specified in this schedule	42.00
27. For delivery of a ship or goods to a purchaser	42.00
28. For attending the discharge of cargo or removal of a ship or goods	42.00 per day or part of a day.
29. For opening office (or office remaining open) after hours for urgent execution of process	139.00 per hour or part of an hour.
30. On the gross proceeds of any ship or goods sold—	
(a) for every \$200 or part of \$200 up to \$20 000	9.00
(b) for each additional \$200 or part of \$200	6.00
31. For retaining possession of a ship (with or without cargo) or of a ship's cargo	27.00 per day or part of a day.

(No fee is payable for the custody and possession of property seized if it consists of money in a bank, or goods stored in a bonded warehouse, or if it is in the custody of a customs house officer or other authorised person.

In addition to the fees specified in this schedule, the Marshal may recover all expenses reasonably incurred in the execution of the duties referred to in this schedule, including—

- sums expended in attending the discharge of a ship or goods;*
- sums paid to a shipkeeper;*
- sums paid for the safe custody of property;*
- travelling expenses;*
- necessary meals;*
- sums paid to engage assistants;*
- postage, telephone calls;*
- fees paid to auctioneers or appraisers.*

Such fee (if any) as the Registrar may determine is payable for any procedure or service not specified in this schedule.

A deposit on account of the fees applicable to any proceeding may be required before the proceeding is commenced, or at any time during the course of the proceeding and a memorandum of the amount deposited must be delivered to the party making the deposit. An undertaking in writing to pay any further fees which may become payable beyond the amount deposited may be required.)
