#### 1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Youth Court (Fees) Regulations 1996*.

#### 4—Interpretation

In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—  
*the Act* means the *Youth Court Act 1993*.

#### 5—Fees

- (1) Pursuant to section 33 of the Act, the fees set out in Schedule 1 are payable to the Court in relation to proceedings in the Court.
- (2) The Court may require a non-refundable deposit as security for the payment of fees for the production of a transcript of the hearing of a case at the request of a party where the Court does not require the transcript.

2	On application for an adoption order under the <i>Adoption Act 1988</i>	\$109.00
3	For making an enforcement order under the <i>Expiation of Offences Act 1996</i>	\$141.00
4	For copy of evidence	\$5.20 per page
5	For copy of reasons for judgment	\$5.20 per page

	A party to proceedings is entitled to 1 copy of the reasons without charge.	
6	For copy of any other document	\$3.20 per page
