



a bonded store of the said Province, as aftermentioned: And any person who shall have in his possession any still, without having obtained such licence shall forfeit and pay not less than One Hundred Pounds, nor more than Five Hundred Pounds.

Notice to be given of intention to use still.

3. Every person who shall have received such licence shall leave at the nearest Police Office or Station a notice, in writing, of the place where and the time when he intends to commence and cease to distil, at least three days prior to such commencement, and also a like notice of his intention to recommence such distillation after any discontinuance thereof, and every such notice shall be delivered at such Police Office or Station, or forwarded through the nearest Post Office as a registered letter; and every person who shall distil without having given such notice, or at any time different from that specified in such notice, shall forfeit and pay a penalty of One Hundred Pounds.

Licence may be withdrawn.

4. If a holder of such licence shall at any time contravene any of the provisions of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Treasurer to withdraw such licence, and to cause notice of such withdrawal to be published in the *South Australian Government Gazette*.

Spirits to be placed in bond before being sold.

5. Any person wishing to sell or dispose of any spirits so distilled shall first lodge the same in one of the bonded stores of the said Province, and the same shall not be removed from such stores until after payment of the duty hereinafter mentioned.

Duty to be paid on spirits distilled under Act.

6. Upon all spirits distilled under the provisions of this Act, and which shall be placed in bond as aforesaid, there shall be levied a rate or duty of Six Shillings and Ninepence for each imperial gallon of such spirits, not exceeding the strength of hydrometer proof, and so in proportion for spirits of greater strength, and the same shall be paid to the Treasurer, or other person appointed to receive the same for the public use of the said Province.

Penalty for illegally selling spirits.

7. Any person who shall sell, or dispose, or purchase, or offer to sell, or dispose, or purchase any spirits distilled under the provisions of this Act, without the same being previously placed in bond as aforesaid, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay the sum of One Hundred Pounds.

Spirits to be forfeited.

8. All spirits distilled, or sold, or disposed of, or offered to be sold, or disposed of, or removed, contrary to the provisions of this Act, shall be forfeited.

Spirits not to be removed without permit.

9. It shall not be lawful to remove any spirits, distilled under the provisions of this Act, from the premises where the same were distilled, without having a permit to remove the same, signed by the nearest Special Magistrate, or any officer to be appointed for that purpose.

Governor to make rules.

10. It shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent

consent of the Executive Council, to make such rules as he may consider necessary to carry the provisions of this Act into effect, and to appoint such officers and other persons for that purpose as may be deemed fit and proper.

11. It shall be lawful for any police constable, or other person duly appointed by the Governor for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time the premises upon which a licensed still is kept.

Police officers may visit.

12. All penalties and forfeitures hereby imposed shall be recoverable in a summary way before two or more Justices of the Peace, and shall be paid or applied one moiety to the Treasurer of the said Province in aid of the General Revenue thereof, and the other moiety shall be divided between the seizing officer and the person giving the information which led to such seizure, in such proportions as the convicting Justices may decide, or, if there be no person giving such information, then such moiety shall be paid or given to such seizing officer.

Recovery and application of penalties.

13. This Act shall commence and take effect from and after the passing hereof.
