An Act to further amend an Ordinance, No. 17 of 1844, intituled "An Ordinance to Define the Qualifications of Medical Practitioners in this province for certain purposes," and to repeal Ordinance No. 1 of 1846.

[Assented to, October 28th, 1880.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to further amend an Ordinance, No. 17 of 1844, intituled "An Ordinance to Define the Qualifications of Medical Practitioners in this province for certain purposes"—Be it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in the present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. This Act may for all purposes be cited as the "Medical Act, 1880." Short title.

2. This Act and the said Ordinance, No. 17 of 1844, shall be incorporated, and shall be read and construed together as forming one Act. Incorporation.

3. The first section of the said Ordinance, No. 17 of 1844, and the whole of the Ordinance, No. 1 of 1846, "To amend an Ordinance, intituled 'An Ordinance to define the qualifications of Medical Practitioners in the province for certain purposes,'" are hereby repealed. Repeal.

4. No person shall, after the passing of this Act, be deemed to be Qualifications of

medical practitioner,
how determined.

a legally-qualified medical practitioner, unless such person shall have proved to the satisfaction of the majority of the members present, not being less than three of the Medical Board, that he is possessed of one of the qualifications mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and shall have received from the said Board a certificate of his being a legally-qualified medical practitioner: Provided that nothing in this section contained shall apply to any person who, previous to the passing of this Act, shall have received from the Medical Board a certificate of his being a legally-qualified medical practitioner according to the terms of the said Ordinance, No 17 of 1844.

SCHEDULE.

1. Fellow, Member, Licentiate, or Extra-Licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians of London.
2. Fellow, Member, or Licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh.
3. Fellow or Licentiate of the King's and Queen's Colleges of Physicians of Ireland.
4. Fellow or Member of the Royal College of Surgeons of England.
5. Fellow or Licentiate of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh.
6. Fellow or Licentiate of the Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow.
7. Fellow or Licentiate of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland.
8. Licentiate of the Society of Apothecaries, London.
9. Licentiate of the Apothecaries' Hall, Dublin.
10. Doctor, or Bachelor of Medicine, or Master in Surgery of any chartered University in Her Majesty's Dominions authorised to grant degrees in medicine and surgery.
11. Any qualification entitling the holder to be registered in the United Kingdom under the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 21st and 22nd year of Her Majesty, c. 90, or any amendment thereof.
12. Any qualification which would entitle the holder to practice in all branches of medicine in any foreign state, and also to hold medical Government appointments in such state.
