An Act to amend the "Gold Mining Act, No. 353 of 1885," so far as relates to new Goldfields.

[Assented to, September 8th, 1886.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Act No. 353 of 1885, Preamble. intituled "An Act to amend the Laws relating to Gold Mining, and for other purposes"-Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. Every goldfield proclaimed after the passing of this Act under Definition of new section 10 of "The Gold Mining Act, 1885," shall be deemed to goldfield. be a new goldfield until after the lapse of two years from the date of the first Proclamation of such goldfield in the Government Gazette.

2. A miner's right issued to any Asiatic alien shall be available Miner's right issued only for the particular goldfield or locality described in such right.

to Asiatic alien available only for goldfield described.

3. No miner's right shall be issued to any Asiatic alien for work- Miners' rights issued ing on any new goldfield: Provided that this section shall not apply to any goldfield of which the first discoverer was an Asiatic alien.

to Asiatic aliens not available on new goldfield

- 4. The fee for a miner's right in the Northern Territory shall be Fee for miner's right. Ten Shillings.
- 5. If any Asiatic alien shall be found mining upon any new Penalty on Asiatic goldfield he may, after notice from any Warden requesting him to aliens mining on new

goldfields.

leave such goldfield, be removed therefrom by order of any Warden, and shall further be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten Pounds, and in default of payment shall be liable to be imprisoned with or without hard labor for any period not exceeding one month.

Incorporation.

6. The provisions of this Act shall only apply to that portion of the province north of the twenty-sixth parallel of south latitude.

Limitation of Act.

7. This Act and "The Gold Mining Act, 1885," except so far as inconsistent, shall be incorporated and read together as one Act.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
