An Act to fix a Scale for the Payment of Jurors in Criminal Cases, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, October 14th, 1891.]

DE it Enacted by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows, that is to say:

1. In lieu of the payments provided for by "The Jury Act Amendment Act, 1865," payments shall be made out of the General Revenue to jurymen attending criminal sittings according to the following scale:-

To each juryman, for each day's attendance... **Eight Shillings**

To each juryman, for each mile in distance between the residence of such juryman, as appearing on the jury-list, and the place where the sittings are held.....

Scale of payment.

Limit of radius 2. No person shall be summoned as a juror to attend any within which jury

criminal sittings who shall reside more than ten miles from the place may be summoned.

Sixpence

3. Jury lists, jurors' books, and jurors' rolls made since the lists. passing of "The Jury Act Amendment Act, 1886," or hereafter to be made, shall remain in operation for a period of five years, or for such less period as the Governor may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette direct. 4. This
