An Act to apply, out of the General Revenue, the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds to the Service of the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

[*Assented to, November 8th, 1893.*]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. Out of the General Revenue of the said province there shall be issued and applied, from time to time, for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds.

Issue and application

2. No payments for any establishment or service shall be made out of the said sum in excess of the rates voted for similar establishments or services on the Estimates for the year ended the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, except so far as such rates are modified by the "Civil Service Act, 1874," and nothing in this Act shall limit the effect of "The Public Salaries Act, 1893."
