An Act to amend "The Licensing Act, 1908."

[*Assented to, December 7th, 1910.*]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited alone as "The Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1910"; and "The Licensing Act, 1908" (hereinafter called the principal Act), and this Act may be cited together as "The Licensing Acts, 1908 and 1910." Short title.

2. This Act and the principal Act are incorporated and shall be read together as one Act. Incorporation.

3. The principal Act is hereby amended as follows:—

Bonâ fide traveller provisions repealed.

i. In section 155, subsection (2), the word "or" is inserted before the words "any *bonâ fide* lodger," and the words "or any *bonâ fide* traveller" are struck out.

ii. Sections 157, 158, and 160 are repealed.

iii. In section 163, the words "a *bonâ fide* traveller or," and the words and figures "section 158 or" are struck out.

4. Subsection 4 of section 168 of the Principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted in lieu thereof:—
Every licensee upon whose licensed premises any person is so found shall, upon proof to the satisfaction of the Special Magistrate or Justices Amendment of sec. 168 of the principal Act.

The Licensing Act Amendment Act.—1910.

Justices hearing the case that such person was on such premises for an unlawful purpose with the consent or knowledge of the licensee, be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five Pounds.

No conviction prior to the passing of this Act under the said subsection shall be held to be a conviction within the meaning of or for the purposes of section 70 of the principal Act, and any Special Magistrate to whom application by the licensee against whom such conviction was made shall remove the indorsement of such conviction from the licence of such licensee.
