An Act to further amend the Opticians Act, 1920.

[Assented to, December 6th, 1923.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Opticians Act Amendment Act, 1923." Short titles.

(2) The Opticians Acts, 1920 and 1922, and this Act may be cited together as the "Opticians Act, 1920 to 1923."

(3) The Opticians Act, 1920, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act." No. 1443 of 1920.

2. Paragraph (f) of subsection (1) of section 20 of the principal Act is amended so as to read as follows:— Amendment of principal Act, s. 20, (1)—

(f) who, during the full period of seven years next before the first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty, has been carrying on the practice of optometry in the State as a means of livelihood at a fixed place of business within the State: Provided he is of good character and makes application in the prescribed form before the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, and makes a statutory declaration in the form prescribed that he has so practised. Persons practising optometry for seven years prior to the first day of December, 1920, entitled to registration.
