An Act to amend the Sale of Goods Act, 1895, by enacting certain provisions relating to sales of wool.

[Assented to, 19th November, 1936.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Sale of Goods Act Amendment Act, 1936". Short titles.

(2) The Sale of Goods Act, 1895, and this Act may be cited as the "Sale of Goods Acts, 1895 and 1936". 680, 1895.

2. This Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation. No such proclamation shall be made unless the Governor is satisfied that legislation similar to section 4 is in force in all the States of Australia (other than South Australia), in the Dominion of New Zealand and in the Union of South Africa. Commencement of Act.

3. This Act is incorporated with the Sale of Goods Act, 1895, and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation.

4. The following section is hereby enacted and inserted in the Sale of Goods Act, 1895, after section 57 thereof :— Enactment of s. 57A of Sale of Goods Act, 1895—

57A. Any term express or implied in any contract of sale of wool entered into after the commencement of the Sale of Goods Act Amendment Act, 1936, providing that in computing the price of the wool any deduction of the kind commonly known as the draft allowance is to be made from the weight of the wool, shall be void. Avoidance of provision for draft allowance.
