## Emergency Management (COVID-19) (Peppers Waymouth Isolation) Direction 2020

under section 25 of the *Emergency Management Act 2004*

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### Preamble

- 1 On 22 March 2020 I, Grantley Stevens, Commissioner of Police, being the State Co-ordinator for the State of South Australia pursuant to section 14 of the *Emergency Management Act 2004* (the *Act*), declared pursuant to section 23 of the Act that a Major Emergency is occurring in respect of the outbreak of the Human Disease named COVID-19 within South Australia.
- 2 Now I, Grantley Stevens, being of the opinion that this is necessary to achieve the purposes of the Act, give the following directions pursuant to section 25 of the Act.

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### 1—Short title

This direction may be cited as the *Emergency Management (COVID-19) (Peppers Waymouth Isolation) Direction 2020*.

### 2—Application of direction

- (1) Except as provided in subclause (2), this direction applies to any person who was physically present on the site of the Peppers Waymouth Hotel Adelaide, including a guest, worker or contractor, between 0001 hours on 15 November 2020 and 0001 hours on 16 November 2020.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply to any person who was directed to enter the site of the Peppers Waymouth Hotel Adelaide as part of the COVID-19 outbreak response and was wearing full personal protective equipment.

### 3—Isolation requirement

A person to whom this direction applies—

- (a) must, unless paragraph (b) applies—
  - (i) travel by the most direct practical route and means to a premises that they are directed to by SA Health, if not already at those premises; and
  - (ii) reside and remain at those premises, isolated and segregated from other persons for a 14-day period commencing on 16 November 2020; and
  - (iii) remain at those premises, except—

- (A) for the purposes of obtaining medical care or medical supplies; or
  - (B) in any other emergency situation; or
  - (C) for any reason approved in advance by the State Co-ordinator or his delegate or an authorised officer; and
- (iv) take reasonable steps to ensure that no other person enters the premises unless that other person—
- (A) usually resides at the premises; or
  - (B) is also complying with a direction to isolate; or
  - (C) is required to provide care and support to, or receive care and support from, the person to whom this direction applies at the place; or
  - (D) is required for medical or emergency purposes; and
- (v) follow all reasonable directions from a treating medical practitioner;
- (b) if advised by a medical practitioner of testing positive to COVID-19, must remain in a health or other facility in accordance with that advice, and must follow all reasonable directions from a treating medical practitioner, until a medical practitioner certifies that the person meets the criteria for discharge from a health or other facility.

#### 4—Testing and symptoms of COVID-19

- (1) A person to whom this direction applies must submit to a COVID-19 test if directed to do so by a person acting on behalf of SA Health or an authorised officer.
- (2) A person required to submit to a COVID-19 test under this clause must not refuse or fail to comply with a reasonable requirement or direction of a person in relation to the conduct of the COVID-19 test.
- (3) If a person to whom this direction applies displays symptoms of COVID-19, the person must immediately notify SA Health of those symptoms.
- (4) In this section—

*COVID-19 test* means a Polymerase Chain Reaction test to diagnose COVID-19 of a kind determined by the Chief Public Health Officer (or delegate).


**5—Powers of authorised officers**

Nothing in this direction derogates from the powers of authorised officers to exercise powers pursuant to the Act.
